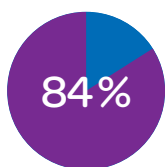

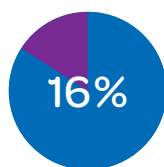

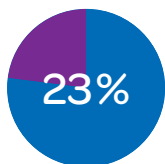
84 percent studied to

the labour market.



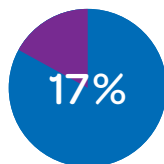
16 percent should have

college.



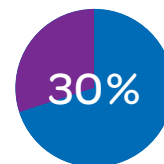
On average, students

and group work.



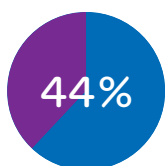
Almost a quarter of the

demands** on them...



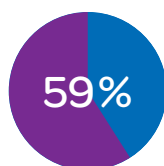
...while 17 percent feel

are **too low**.



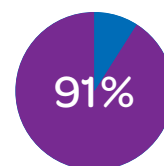
30 percent feel that
